SECTION REGULATIONS: (To be read in conjunction with General Regulations)

All exhibits must be delivered to the Craft Pavilion between
10am and 5pm on WEDNESDAY, MARCH 24th 2010

Exhibits may be posted to Craft Section, P.O. Box 69, Red
Hill Sth 3937, and will be returned, provided return postage
is included.

1. Exhibits **MUST** be the work of the exhibitor.
2. No more than 5 exhibits per person, per class will be accepted.
3. Exhibits cannot be entered in more than one class.
4. Care should be taken when completing Entry Form to place exhibits in their correct class. The Chief Steward has the right to transfer any exhibit to its correct class if wrongly entered. However, the Chief Steward will not be responsible for any exhibit reaching the Judge entered in an incorrect class. If in doubt, please do not hesitate to ask when delivering your exhibit.
5. The Chief Steward has the right to make separate classes if sufficient numbers of articles of similar types are entered in any class, or to combine classes where there are insufficient exhibits.
6. Articles must not have been previously worn or washed. Soiled work will not be accepted.
7. Exhibits must have been completed in the last 2 years.
8. No exhibit that has been shown at a previous Red Hill Show is eligible for re-entry.
9. Exhibit ID tickets will be forwarded with receipt for entries and must be firmly attached to each exhibit with a small safety pin, or affixed to the back of framed articles.
10. The exhibitors name should not appear on any exhibit. It can be covered up if necessary.
11. Prizes will not be awarded if insufficient entries in class.
12. **Official Receipt must be produced as identification when reclaiming exhibits at the conclusion of the show.**
13. All exhibits must remain on display until 4.30pm on Show Day when the Pavillion will be closed to prepare for collection of exhibits by 5.00pm.
14. The Society will take all care, but will not be responsible for any loss or damage, the exhibits being the sole risk of the exhibitor.

CLASSES

1. Creative Embroidery. Showing exhibitor's own design, including a combination of stitches, ribbons and threads. Articles must not be predominantly cross stitch. May include mounted or free standing work. Size limit of work -1m x 40cm.
2. Cross Stitch on Aida Cloth, 16 to 22 count
3. Cross Stitch on even weave/linen, 25 to 32 count
4. Stump work or raised embroidery
5. Any other type of embroidery not previously provided for (excluding cross stitch)
6. Apron
7. Child's garment - hand finished
8. Baby's garment – hand finished
9. Appliqué - 1 article, hand or machine made
10. Appliqué - machine made, 1 article
11. Patchwork, hand or machine pieced and quilted by exhibitor
12. Patchwork, hand or machine pieced and commercially quilted
13. Applique, hand or machine made
14. Patchwork, hand pieced and hand quilted
The Mrs Beverley Breeschoten Perpetual Trophy will be presented for the best exhibit from Classes 11,12,13 & 14
The winner will also receive \$50 and sash.
15. Hand Embroidered baby's blanket/quilt
16. Machine Embroidered baby's blanket/quilt
17. Knitted or Crochet bedspread or cot cover
18. Crochet household article (e.g. doiley, table cloth)
19. Coathanger
20. Cushion
21. Teddy bear
22. A Soft Toy - knitted or crochet
23. A Soft Toy - other than knitted or crochet
24. Toy suitable for teenager's bedroom
25. Dressed doll in knitted or crochet clothes

34. Jumper or Cardigan - handknitted or crochet, for adult
35. Socks (any style)
36. Knee, Travel or Afghan Rug - knitted or crochet
37. Machine knitted article or garment for baby
38. Machine knitted garment for child (4-10 yrs)
39. Machine knitted garment for adult
40. Machine knitted any other article/garment or accessory (includes cushion cover, coat hanger, scarf, hat etc)
41. Wool Embroidery Exhibit

42. Hand woven exhibit
43. Skeins of handspun wool. Minimum 200g total weight. Totally prepared by exhibitor. Fleece sample attached.
44. Skeins of handspun wool. Minimum 200g. Using commercially prepared wool tops.
45. Handknitted or crocheted cap or hat from handspun wool.
46. Handknitted or crocheted garment from handspun wool.
47. An exhibit (eg garment, article) made from handspun fibre (wool, mohair)
48. Article made from fleece using any other technique (e.g. felting)

 67. Jewellery – handmade, 1 exhibit
 68. Porcelain doll, reproduced, under 21cm length (head must be porcelain).
 69. Porcelain doll, reproduced, over 21cm length (head must be porcelain)
 70. Pottery - earthenware or stoneware, hand built, 1 piece
 71. Pottery - earthenware or stoneware, made on wheel, 1 piece
 72. Ceramic article made with commercial mould
 73. China Painting – 1 article
 74. Paper tole picture (framed)
 75. Basket made from reeds, rushes or other natural materials
 76. Picture using natural materials
 77. Folk Art – 1 article
 78. Leadlight – 1 article (no larger than 60cm x 60cm)
 79. Tassel
