SECTION REGULATIONS: (To be read in conjunction with General Regulations).

- Entry form must include Date of Birth, Name of Animal, Tattoo and Breed.
- All animals entered in the Beef Classic must be registered with their respective Breed Societies.
- The age of all cattle is at 24 March 2012.
- All cattle must remain on the Showgrounds until after the Grand Parade.
- **Cattle Herd Health Status Declaration** (attached) must be completed by Exhibitor.
- **Livestock Disease Control Act (1994)** The Department of Primary Industry advises that **all** cattle leaving a Victorian property, **including cattle attending agricultural shows**, must be carrying a National Livestock Identification Scheme (NLIS) tag at the time of dispatch. DPI scanning will take place on Show Day. No exceptions.
- **Cattle will be allocated a position in the yards by the Head Steward in accordance with DPI regulations.**

OWNERS LIABILITY INSURANCE

Owners or persons responsible for animals are indemnified for their legal liability for bodily injury or damage to property of third parties as a result of an occurrence caused by animals (livestock) whilst attending and participating in Show events. This is covered upon receipt of the appropriate Entry Fee

HEALTH REQUIREMENTS FOR CATTLE ENTERING THE ANNUAL RED HILL SHOW
Cattle entering the Red Hill Show must satisfy the health requirements in respect of Johne's Disease. These requirements aim to help protect the health status of other exhibitor's cattle by reducing the risk of diseased animals entering the Showgrounds. It is the responsibility of the exhibitor to check and ensure that the cattle to be exhibited satisfy the health requirements.

To be conducted at end of Cattle Judging. Entries must be lodged with the Head Cattle Steward by 12.00 noon on Show Day.
